Tsuen Wan uniquely blends Eastern and Western cultures, combining modern urban life with traditional heritage. Once transformed by Shanghai industrialists into a textile hub in the 1940s, the area now combines historical sites with bustling modern developments, earning the nickname "Little Manchester". Despite the decline of its textile industry, Tsuen Wan retains its cultural roots, with preserved villages and temples where locals continue traditional practices. A visit here reveals a seamless coexistence of cosmopolitan dynamics and ancient traditions.

Tsuen Wan unfurls its splendor with an impressive network of sky bridges, extending over one kilometer. These elevated pathways connect a constellation of 20 shopping malls, including the nearby Nina Mall and the paternity D·PARK. This architectural marvel not only enhances the shopping experience but also offers you a unique vantage point to revel in their retail journey.

From Noah's Ark on Ma Wan, uncover the finest vantage points to behold the splendid Tsing Ma Bridge and capture its grandeur in stunning panoramic




Sam Tung Uk Museum 7

Nina Park



Nina Park Wood Fossil Garden is located in Tsuen Wan, adjacent to Nina Tower, Nina Mall, and Nina Hotel Tsuen Wan West. The Park and



its facilities cover approximately 70,000 sq.ft., showcasing over 100 museum-grade wood fossils. These precious specimens, constituting a significant natural historical legacy, are part of the private collection of the late chairwoman of Chinachem Group, Mrs. Nina Wang. As Hong Kong's first and only wood fossil park, the site combines an engaging "edutainment" design with advanced technology, allowing local and international visitors to take on a journey through millions of years of geological history to inspire, educate, and entertain.
